Pitman Robertson and Dingle/Johnson dollars, which are special taxes on both hunters and fishermen, are a direct financial benefit to SNC's mission and that money has been coming directly to the state for many years.

The hunting and fishing community are one of the primary recreational users of public land within SNC's purview. Hunters and fishermen greatly benefits local communities within the Sierra through lodging, food, gas, retail purchases, use fees, etc.

Law abiding hunters and fishermen tend to spend a lot of time in the field and oftentimes are the first line of defense for observing and reporting illegal activity.
