More than 60 percent of California's developed water supply starts in the Sierra Nevada and nearly half of the water that flows into the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta comes from the rivers of the Sierra Nevada.

This Annual Report emphasizes SNC's commitment to protecting and enhancing Sierra benefits for all of California by showcasing SNC activities that improve forest health, remediate mercury contamination from abandoned mines, protect critical natural resources, and reduce the risk of catastrophic wildfire.
