Placer Land Trust is hosting a cleanup site Saturday in Roseville as part of the Great Sierra River Cleanup, a concerted effort to remove trash from waterways throughout the Sierra Nevada region.

Volunteers, including local Cub Scouts and Brownies, will help clear the trails and waterway of garbage and debris along Miners Ravine Trail. The cleanup is scheduled in conjunction with the California Coastal Cleanup Day, purported to be the biggest volunteer day in the state.

Jeff Darlington, executive director for Placer Land Trust, said local volunteers collected nearly 800 pounds of trash last year.
